Dr. Coats retired from the IMF after 26-year service in May 2003 as Assistant Director of the Monetary and Capital Markets Department, where he led technical assistance missions to more than twenty countries. He was chief of the SDR division in the Finance Department of the IMF from 1982–88. He served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Cayman Islands Monetary Authority in 2003-2010. He was a visiting economist at the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System and the World Bank. He taught economics at Univ. of Virginia. He is the author of One Currency for Bosnia. He was part of the IMF's program team for Afghanistan from 2010 to end 2013 and has been member of the editorial board of the Cayman Financial Review since 2010. He has a BA in Economics from the UC Berkeley and a PhD in Economics from the University of Chicago.
