Gerald P. Dwyer is a Professor and BB&T Scholar at Clemson University. He also is an Adjunct Scholar at the Cato Institute. He was Director of the Center for Financial Innovation and Stability and Vice President at the Federal Reserve Bank of Atlanta from 1997 to 2012. Dr. Dwyer's research has appeared in leading economics and finance journals, publications by the Federal Reserve Banks of Atlanta and St. Louis, and books. He is a past President and member of the Executive Committee of the Association of Private Enterprise Education. Dr. Dwyer's recent research focuses on the ongoing financial crisis including the implications for economic growth. He also is doing research on the ongoing development of crypto currencies and the associated major innovation: the blockchain. Prof. Dwyer earned his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago in 1979.
