Dr. Sautet is associate professor at the Catholic University of America. In the past, he taught at the University of Paris, NYU, and George Mason University. He was a senior fellow at the Mercatus Center. He also was a senior economist at the New Zealand Treasury and the New Zealand Commerce Commission. Prof. Sautet published widely in the area of entrepreneurship theory, cluster theory, economic development, and institutional economics. He is noted as the co-editor of the 10-volume *Collected Works of Israel M. Kirzner* (Liberty Fund Press) and the author of *An Entrepreneurial Theory of the Firm* (Routledge, 2000). Sautet has also published in popular media in France (*Les Echos, Le Figaro, La Tribune*), in New Zealand (*National Business Review, New Zealand Herald*), and in the US (*Forbes, The Star-Ledger*) Dr. Sautet earned a doctorate in economics from the University of Paris.
